<u>Pastor's Page –</u> From the Pastor—Reflections on Change...who moved my cheese?



In April we offered 2 congregational meetings to prepare for the change coming in which St. John's will move from two pastors to one pastor. A presentation on the "dynamics of change" started each session and 55 members of the church attended. A small book was briefly referenced during our time together and I want to dig a little deeper into the idea behind it.

Who Moved My Cheese? is a parable about change that takes place in a Maze where four characters look for "Cheese"—cheese being a metaphor for what we want in life. The four imaginary characters depicted in the story—the mice: "Sniff" and "Scurry," and the Little people: "Hem" and

"Haw"—are intended to represent the simple and the complex parts of ourselves. Whatever parts of us we choose to use, we all share something in common: **a need to find our way in the Maze and if we want to succeed in changing times.** Our four characters begin with a delicious cache of cheese that they enjoy nibbling on each day, until one day; they arrive at the location to be startled by the fact: their cheese is gone! Sniff & Scurry head off into the maze to see if they can find a new pile of cheese, but Hem & Haw are stuck. They end up paralyzed in the empty spot crying, "Who moved our cheese?" This simple parable has some good life lessons we can all apply. By the end of the tale the four little characters have each experienced these realities. The two mice accepted these lessons quite easily, but the little people had to learn the hard way. (If you want to catch the whole story just google the title and enjoy a quick read)

Change Happens. They Keep Moving The Cheese

Anticipate Change. Get Ready For The Cheese To Move

Monitor Change. Smell The Cheese Often So You Know When It Is Getting Old.

Adapt To Change Quickly. The Quicker You Let Go Of Old Cheese, The Sooner You Can Enjoy New

We didn't really talk much about cheese at our congregational meetings. We did discuss the changes that will come when Pastor Jae moves to his new church. The coming season of transition may elicit many feelings inside as we each experience this change differently. Donna Honold's presentation was recorded and is now available on the church website. Pastor Jae has had responsibility in a wide variety of areas at St. John's but I named three priorities that Staff-Pastor-Parish Relations Committee (SPPRC) has identified and been working on over the last few months to prepare for his move. Those priorities include: (1) preaching (2) pastoral care/visitation (3) support for technology and the media team in worship. The other areas under his leadership will be cared for in time, but this is our starting point.

- 1. For Preaching responsibility: Pastor Jeff will be the weekly preacher with others invited into the rotation during his vacation times and breaks.
- 2. Pastoral Care we would invite members to consider the role of Parish Nurse. There is training available in the QCA and this role is how other United Methodist Churches have assisted the pastor with hospital visitation and caring for shut ins.
- 3. Technology support—SPPRC has drafted a job description and will be exploring an internship with college students at local universities that have production departments to train students in this specialty.

We will be gathering those who have volunteered to be part of the "TRANSITION TEAM" in the coming weeks, to develop a strategy for guiding St. John's through this season of transition. If you have questions or new ideas, please submit them to the <u>transition tip</u> box outside the church office. In our effort to communicate updates to the congregation, the SPPRC will seek to respond to your questions in a weekly article in the worship bulletin.

Property Pulse: Monthly Maintenance for the Church building

4/3 - Sewer back up in basement affecting the north end boiler room restrooms and south end youth room and adjacent restrooms.

Petersen Plumbing called to evaluate. Petersen recommended calling B & B Drain Tech.

4/4 - B&B was able to jet pipes and help determine it was an issue with the City storm sewer system at Perry St. manhole. City arrived on site and flushed their system to remove the obstruction and the water receded from the basement.

4/10 - Actually Clean arrived and cleaned the flooded basement area.

4/18 - Plans moving forward are to have Ragan plumbing install backflow balls in all the drains in the basement. Additional floor cleaning in the basement will be scheduled for the rooms not flooded. Trustee's plan to ask the City of Davenport for reimbursement for these costs, which will total approximately \$5000 or more.

4/22 – Our current Maintenance Director (Brian Jenkins) is living in the Parish House. During a scheduled walk through it was reported that the freezer part of the refrigerator in the Parish House is no longer working. A new refrigerator will be purchased.

Church History | Art Collection

St. John's owns a collection of original and reproduction art works which can be seen in various places around the church. Some of these are by world famous artists. Some are by local artists. Some are by members of our church. Some of these are not currently on view.

In 1996 members Marj and Percy Hier designed and built several stained-glass panels including an eagle symbolizing St. John, which is above the Perry Street lobby door. Another set of their glass

panels were in the elevator lobby doorway. This set is currently in storage with hopes to redisplay later. Percy and Marj also created the window at the foot of the steps to Fellowship Hall and the transom above the hall leading out of the 14th Street lobby. This window is an exact match of an original one above the doors from the porte cochere into the 14th St. lobby. The stained-glass lamp currently in the Parlor was created by Rev. Steve Braudt, former Pastor Ann Lippincott's husband. Father Edward Catich, head of the St. Ambrose art department, created the lighted, stained-glass panel called <u>Flight into Egypt</u> in the Perry St. lobby.

Fabric work decorates many places in the church. Most of the banners which flank the chancel in the Sanctuary were created by Liz Jansen and her helpers. Special Father's and Mother's Day banners created with old neckties and old handkerchiefs were created by Deb Buchanan. The quilted and embroidered "Welcome to St. John's" items in the lobbies were created by Carolyn Rancier. The larger banners gracing the hall outside the conference room were created by Marilyn Lihs. The angel quilt hanging by the door to the parking lot was made by Maureen Van Loon.

We have two old and large Madonna and Child oil paintings, a tondo (round picture) in the parlor (copy of an original by Raphael) and one in the SW upper entrance to the balcony (artist unknown, probably 19th century Italian copy). This one hung above the altar in the Chapel at one point. Shirley Vorek Heysinger, painted an oil portrait of member Henry Newman who was head of the committee in charge of the 1950 Sanctuary remodel. This sits on an easel in the history room. Donna Lapsey painted the pictures of earlier Methodist church buildings hanging in the conference room and a large picture of members of her family with Jesus, not now on display.

An original Paul Norton watercolor of St. John's church (1979) hangs in the parlor. Local artist Shirley Christensen created a small etching of Christ on the cross which is in storage. There are two larger Isabel Bloom sculptures in the office. There are also several smaller Bloom works scattered around the church. Marj Hier's is also represented by original art work: a watercolor titled <u>White Water</u> and an original print titled <u>Dawning</u>. Take an art tour of St. John's and see how many of these beautiful items you can find.—Shared by the History Committee
